## **BH Fees/Payment arrangements for 2022 –**

This year Bowls England changed the dates for the payment of their competition and affiliation fees but the new method worked well and will be repeated in 2022

Entries for the National Championships (Singles, Pairs etc that lead to Leamington), together with County Competitions, should now start to be made by players and Clubs will be asked to forward them to your Area Secretary by the end of January. Payment will not be needed at that time

The declaration of your membership will then be required by 1st May at which time payment for those, plus the competition fees, will be due. Details of how to pay will be sent by each Area Secretary

All fees will remain the same as this year

I have had a few enquiries from clubs regarding coaching, in terms of, they want to be able to coach newcomers and don't know where to start. On this subject there were a couple of these who wanted to know if there are any courses which do not have a monetary cost involved.

First port of call for all clubs or individuals who are interested in coaching is to contact the Hampshire Bowls Coaching Association whose details are available on the BH website.

Personally, I would suggest you contact the above to get an idea of what is involved as there are many areas such as Disability Bowls Coaching, Child and Adult Protection, and finally Health and Safety that all have to be factored in. ## **Summary of BE Counties Meeting - Hazel Marke**

Having recently returned from the Counties meeting the following are the main topics: -

The majority of attendees in favour of redefining Championships and Competitions with championships held at RLS and competitions at venues around the Country. If this was implemented it would give opportunity to go back to more qualifiers.

Most were also in favour of an open draw.

Almost unanimous support for the restoration of the Badge Presentation at RLS.

Middleton Cup/Johns Trophy whether knockout of league discussed as no consensus. BH's proposition will go to the AGM to be voted on.

More live streaming at championships next summer.

The Big Bowls weekend will run again in 2022.

BE also looking at a Pay & Play Platform, seems a good concept but practicalities of implementation will require greater study.

BE also looking at new games format for new bowlers lasting approximately an hour.

This February will see the 1<sup>st</sup> BE Awards dinner to be held in Leicester recognising County, club, team, player, greenkeeper, coach, official of the year. Also, there will be an award for story of the year and Unsung Hero.

The BH executive have put forward a proposition for the reinstatement of the National Championship winners award dinner, this will be voted on at the AGM.
